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Abstract. The article is about foreign language learning. Reading aloud

Beginning with the first book, read aloud. Such a method will improve your memorization and pronunciation of words. Use the transcription of words to practice correct pronunciation and intonation. You can record yourself on the recorder, listening to the audio after each new reading. This will help you to evaluate your speaking and hear mistakes that you should work on.

# Comparative reading

An interesting method of learning a foreign language is to read the original book and the translation simultaneously. You can quickly view the text in your native language if you do not understand the entire text in a foreign language.

Reading while listening to the audiobook

Reading while you listen is one of the best ways to learn a foreign language, although it requires a lot of effort. You have to work with two different forms of media – listening and reading. Listening while you read will help you to improve your pronunciation. You will understand that a word can have several pronunciations and whether you pronounce words correctly. You should start reading with a work that you have already read in your native language or an easy genre: a poem or a song. The variety of media will help you to consolidate knowledge and allow you to get used to the spoken language.

# The adapted literature

Find easy-to-read books, namely adapted books. After all, they are designed for those who are learning a foreign language, because they are written for the purpose of learning the language. Such books contain not only a translation of the work, but also a vocabulary and exercises for understanding the text and grammar.

## The original books

If you have realized that you are reading adapted literature without the help of a dictionary, you can switch to reading in the original. You will be able to appreciate the author's metaphors and phrases, ambiguous idioms and original grammatical constructions. You can read works in reverse chronological order. Start with modern authors and end with ancient ones, because you need to learn what is relevant first. You can leave the old works for familiarization later.

## Screen adaptation of the work

Watching movies will make it easier to read the original literature. Nowadays, many popular books and bestsellers have movie versions. This will give you a basic understanding of the plot before reading the piece itself.

When you read works in a foreign language, you use the language as a practical tool in such a way that you get one step closer to fluency. Reading becomes your hobby, which brings pleasure and enjoyment in the language learning process.
